think we were the only people in Putney who wanted to take this place on," says Ancia Cronje of the derelict Edwardian property she and husband Andre renovated. The building was completely run-down, but for this ambitious duo it only added to the challenge. The couple had been looking for a project - a house they could make their own for themselves and their teenage son - and this ramshackle dwelling offered bundles of potential.

Andre and Ancia are originally from South Africa so plenty of light and outdoor living space were key objectives of the redesign. They decided to dig out the basement and tack a double-height glass box onto the back of the house, which floods the ground and lower ground floors with natural light. Moreover, by creating a mezzanine layout, where stairs from the dining area lead down into a voluminous living. room, the family spaces feel even more open, airy and connected. The pair then had a stunning kitchen designed for them by Amy Chanof Kitchen Architecture, which blends effortlessly with the garden both visually and functionally. Here, Ancia tells us more about the kitchen design process...

## What made you choose Kitchen Architecture?

I've wanted to use the company in past projects but haven't had the budget so we went to see the showroom and I just fell in love with the finishes. The kitchens are so elegant and the craftsmanship is beautiful.

### So you wanted something contemporary?

We do actually really like classical design and I have always loved European antiques, but this was a modern extension on an Edwardian house so we wanted a mix of old and new. We didn't want a wooden or country-style kitchen and we knew that a Bulthaup one, in neutrals or greys, would work well in here.

### What was your brief to your designer, Amy?

We want to live outside as much as possible so it had to function in a way that, when we are eating or entertaining out on the patio, it all works seamlessly as one space. Other than that we pretty much gave Amy free rein to put a proposal forward - I'm quite creative, but when it comes to kitchen planning, she's the expert and knows how everything works. For example, I originally had a different colour in mind for the wall units - I wanted a more putty colour, but she said to go for the white. I wasn't sure, but she said 'trust me' and I'm glad

### What about appliances - did you have a wishlist?

I was gung ho on Gaggenau from the start so everything is Gaggenau and I have been extremely happy with them all. Amy made an appointment for me to go to a demonstration to see all the appliances in action and that was great

### What's the highlight of the kitchen for you?

The Island with the induction hob - I really enjoy cooking on it. Also I'm a very clean person and I got sick of scrubbing gas hobs, so I love that now I can just wipe it down as fast as lightning. For Andre, I think it would have to be the wine storage unit!

## Homeowner Ancia Cronje says...

Which research tools did you find the most useful when starting out?

I looked at loads of magazines and websites –
